WORKING MEMORY

What is working memory?

Working memory refers to how we hold, process and manipulate new information that enters our brain. This allows us to interpret and respond to new information. We use working memory to complete many tasks such as following instructions, solving problems and learning new information.

Here are some tips to improve your child's working memory at home.

Enhance your child's WORKING MEMORY at home

Teach visualisation skills:

- Visualisation skills involve using imagery to represent a piece of information.
- When giving your child an instruction prompt them to picture it in their mind.

Eg: Parent: "Put your lunch box and school books in your bag." Child: "What?"

Parent: "Make a picture in your head of what should be in your school bag. Tell me what it looks like."

Child: "In the front pocket there is my lunch box and in the back pocket there are my school books." Parent: "Great description!"

By describing this picture, it allows your child to better process and remember instructions.



2) Play card games:

- Spend some quality time with your child and play card games such as Snap, Go Fish, Memory and Uno.
- This aides working memory as your child has to remember the rules, what cards they have and all the cards that have been played.
- These fun games help improve working memory as your child has to process and manipulate lots of different information quickly.

3) Number instructions:

When giving instructions, explicitly tell your child how many pieces of information they need to remember.

This prepares your child for the instruction and assists them in remembering multiple points.

E.g. Parent: "Ok, you need to do two things. One: Turn off the TV. Two: Pack away your toys."

Ask your child to repeat back the instructions to ensure they have processed this information correctly.

Apps for Working Memory:

MATRYOSHKA! — A fun puzzle game that uses working-memory skills. Solve a range of puzzles by remembering how to stack smaller dolls into larger ones.

iSays Free— A challenging yet fun game that require involves memorizing colour and sound sequences.
