School Council News

After a great deal of discussion and consideration over the past few years, School Council has decided to privatise the Out of School Hours Care , (OSHC), as of term 3, 2017.

A working party of School Council members and Margaret English, the current OSHC Co-ordinator, researched several major providers of OSHC and met with their representatives to determine what they offered in their service delivery. A recommendation from the working party to outsource the program to Big Childcare, as they provided the highest quality program, was put to School Council last week. Council members voted to follow the recommendation of the working party and therefore, Big Childcare will be the providers of the OSHC program.

The working party was vigilant in determining the quality of the provider, ensuring our students would be participating in an exciting program with the highest quality of care and with the cost being kept the same as our current program. Council members were insistent that quality of care and cost were our highest priorities.

We wish to thank Margaret English and Danielle Newman for overseeing our OSHC for many years and for providing our students with a quality program. Current staff have the option to work for Big Childcare, which is a wonderful opportunity for them.

Buildings and Grounds Update

As mentioned in previous newsletters, we will be receiving new portable classrooms within the next term or two to replace some of our existing ones. This will require strategic management ensuring minimum inconvenience to the day to day running of the school. However there will be areas of the school which will be impacted upon and we will ensure everyone is aware of the restrictions as they happen. We will keep you informed as we find out more information.

Parent Forum

I will be hosting a Parent Forum on June 14th at 2.30 where I will be discussing the Reading process and what we do when we read. There will also be time at the end of this session where you will be able ask questions related to this topic. I aim to be conducting at least one parent session per term, providing an opportunity to discuss the teaching and learning taking place at RHPS. Reading to my child

Why should I read to my child?

Reading is an essential component to promote language development, as it enhances children's vocabulary, builds upon their literacy skills, enables children to become familiar with sounds and words, and helps spark their imagination. Reading also helps children read and spell successfully later in life. Other benefits of reading to children include:

- Promotes curiosity and assists in their brain development.
- Helps children develop their own ideas and way of thinking.
- Acts as a safe way to explore various emotions to help understand change, as well as new and frightening events.
- Helps children learn about the world around them.
- Promotes bonding with your child and helps build a relationship.
- Stories about family and culture give children a sense of belonging. (Raising Children Network, 2016)

How should I read to my child?

Take the time to read to your child each night.

By reading with your child for 15 minutes this will allow them to learn many new words and improve their listening skills.

Some great tips for reading to your child include:

- Use your finger to point out new words and discuss what the word means.
 E.g. "Look at this word, HAIRY. It describes something that has lots and lots of hair. Look at how much hair the dog has, he is so hairy!
- Point to the pictures and ask your child to describe them.
- Your child can also practise following instructions. Ask them to point to particular things.
 E.g. 'Point to the hairy dog.'
- Ask your child questions about the story such as why did this happen, describe the character or change the ending of the book.
