PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

SCHOOL COUNCIL MEETING

RESILIENCE

In the past few newsletters, I have been providing information regarding the importance of resilience and why we need to work together to build this within the children. Last night I attended a lecture at the University of Melbourne where a Professor from Yale University U.S.A. presented his research find-

ings related to Emotional Intelligence. Featuring highly in the stakes for being emotionally intelligent is the ability to be adaptable and resilient. Professor Brackett could not recommend the need to build resilient highly enough to enable them to be functioning and contributing citizens. One of the key resilience skills is being adaptable to change and being able to let go of what no longer helps

you. The ideas, processes, or methodologies that are familiar, and have served you well in the past, may now be the very thing standing in your way from being relevant and effective in your immediate future.

Two tips on how to be more adaptable in the face of change and uncertainty:

a. Look for feedback

You need a mirror to brush your hair so you can see what others are looking at. Likewise, you need to take in feedback so you can see what you are currently blind to.

b. Move beyond comfort


